PRRS is characterized by respiratory problems, like cough and dyspnea, in growing and finishing pigs and reproductive failure in sows, with late term abortion, stillbirth and increased preweaning mortality. In order to combat this disease, the implementation of control protocols (biosecurity and hygiene, immunization) is necessary together with PRRS eradication measures, including total depopulation and repopulation of the farm or the closing of the holding for at least six months, among others.
